Dear Chairman Phillips and Commissioners Christie, Clements, and Danly:

I write in opposition of the proposed Gas Transmission Northwest (GTN) Xpress project because I do not believe it can comply with Oregon's clean energy laws and regulations.

Oregon does not need a scientific report to confirm that climate change is real. Over the last several years, we have experienced severe drought, wildfire, heat, and ice storms. To help reduce personal and businesses losses caused by increasing extreme weather events and prepare Oregonians to be more resilient against future events, Oregon passed strong clean energy and decarbonization laws and regulations in 2020 and 2021. Through these collective programs, Oregon is on track to meet our state's greenhouse gas reduction goals.

The state Attorneys General from Oregon, Washington, and California have scrutinized how the costs of the proposed pipeline expansion could affect our residents over the coming decades, well past our 2050 goals. These laws are not arbitrary or abstract. Companies have enforceable regulations to meet in order to help prepare our state for a cleaner, more resilient future. I respectfully request the Commission only approve this project if it can demonstrably comport with Oregon's existing laws and regulations.
